February 2012

The rhythm of the Christian year provides us with ample opportunities for the renewal and refreshment of our spirits. "For everything there is a season..." We are living in the season after Epiphany. Through our Advent preparations and Christmas celebrations, the Son of God was revealed to us once again as Jesus the Christ. In these days following Epiphany we gather again with Jesus' first disciples and ask the question, "What is this?" We meet Jesus again as we hear of the beginning of his ministry and reflect upon the implications for our lives if we answer his timeless call, "Follow me."

In just a few weeks, this season of revelation will end and we again will receive an invitation into the wilderness of Lent. Lent is our time to prepare ourselves for the glory of Easter. As disciples of Jesus, our lives hinge on his death and resurrection. Because he died and rose again, we too are raised from sin and death. The unavoidable truth remains: the only way to resurrection is through the cross. The only way to life is through death.

Lent is our time to die. "We cannot change without dying."¹ One way or another change comes to all of our lives. The season of Lent gives shape and meaning to change. Lent is a wilderness season. The wilderness is a place of the lost. It is a place where our old comforts and guides no longer speak to us. We leave where we have been and remain unsure of where we are going. For a while we must wander and wait.

Sometimes life drives us out into the wilderness. Birth, death, marriage, divorce, sickness, graduation, unemployment,

retirement, any life change has the potential of being a one-way ticket into the wilderness. Sometimes we arrive by a more subtle route. We outgrow a long cherished belief, a way of thinking, or a relationship. Regardless of how we arrive, the wilderness requires that we spend some time neither here nor there, no longer who we were and not quite who we are becoming.

Embracing Lent enables us to practice wilderness living. Through commitment to spiritual disciplines such as prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we intentionally let go of what we know and who we have become so God is able to show us a new way. We let ourselves die so when Easter dawns we too are resurrected.

An intentional Lent is not easy nor is it comfortable. The wilderness never is. But it is so worth the effort. In *The New Handbook of the Christian Year*, one writer describes the season of Lent in this way: "This is a time for putting aside the sins and failures of the past in light of who we are yet to become by the grace of God."² Easter is a door to new life. Through death and resurrection we discover who God created us to be. This beautiful unfolding of life requires letting go. It demands nothing less than wilderness living. But then again, "The wilderness is where God does some of God's best work."³

Getting Ready for Lent

Opportunities offered by the United Church to deepen our experience of Lent and Easter

Ash Wednesday

A Service of Ashes held on **February 22 at 7:00 p.m.** will begin our observance of the Lenten Season. A simple supper of soup and bread will be provided at 6:00 p.m. free of charge.

Lenten Study: "Intentional Lent"

The Season of Lent is a special time of year set apart to help Christians prepare themselves for Easter. The more intentional we are in our preparations for Easter, the deeper our experience of new life will be on Easter day and beyond. For this reason, Pastor Jennifer has created a Lenten study entitled "Intentional Lent."

"Intentional Lent" will consist of two sessions.

Session One will meet on Sunday, February 26 at 11:30. Our time together will include a simple, free lunch, a presentation by Pastor Jennifer on the history and meaning of Lent and a discussion of Lenten Disciplines, and will conclude with prayer. Each participant will be encouraged to commit to a Lenten practice.

Session Two will meet on Sunday, March 25 at 11:30. This session will include a simple, free lunch and a time to share and reflect on our experiences with our Lenten practices. Pastor Jennifer will also make a presentation on Holy Week and will discuss the history and meaning behind the events of this week including Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

One Great Hour of Sharing

A traditional Lenten observance is made up of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. **On March 18** the United Church will receive the One Great Hour of Sharing Special Mission Offering.

The United Church of Northfield is a 5 for 5 church; meaning our congregation fully supports Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM). We give to Basic Support and all four Special mission offerings (One Great Hour of Sharing, OGHS; Strengthen the Church; Neighbors in Need, NIN; and The Christmas Fund). One Great Hour of Sharing channels resources for international programs in health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries, and both international and domestic disaster response in 138 countries by working with local, national, and international partners. It is administered by Wider Church Ministries, Global Sharing of Resources.

The One Great Hour Sharing Giving Calendar included in this newsletter is an excellent way to learn about the needs around the world and contribute towards the relief of these problems.

WHAT TO EXPECT FOR 2012:

- **NEW Location:** In the recent past, Vermont Conference Annual Meetings have alternated between Lyndon State College and Castleton State College. For a variety of reasons, in 2012 we will meet at the centrally located Vermont Technical College in Randolph Center.
- **NEW Length:** Responding to the changing needs of our delegates, Annual Meeting will move from a **3** day event to a **2** day event.
- **NEW Sunday Worship:** Since Annual Meeting will be in session for most of the day on Sunday, the Annual Meeting Planning team is doing two things: **1)** warmly inviting members of local congregations to join us in Randolph Center for Sunday afternoon worship, and **2)** in April will supply local congregations with resources (based on worship at Annual Meeting) that the laity can use to lead their regular Sunday morning worship services (allowing pastors to attend Annual Meeting on Sunday).
- **NEW Keynote Speaker:** We will be blessed by the presence and gifts of **Rev. Da Vita D. McCallister**, *Associate Conference Minister for Youth and Young Adult Ministries of the Connecticut Conference*. Da Vita is charged with supporting youth and young adult ministries throughout the Conference, supporting and equipping youth workers and ministers, building a youth leadership movement that is multicultural and multiracial, and challenging local churches and Conferences to awaken to the ways God calls young people to leadership in the Church. Da Vita, known as "Day," has over twenty years' experience working in youth and young adult ministries. She was ordained in the Southeast Conference in 2004, and has served in local churches, the Southeast Conference, and as Minister for Youth, Young Adult and Outdoor Ministries at the national setting of the United Church of Christ.
- **Old Favorites:** Along with all that is **NEW**, there will still be Spirit-filled worship, Conference business, Peacemakers' Breakfasts, Workshops (with an emphasis on the arts), Displays, and many opportunities for reflection, renewal, fellowship and celebration.

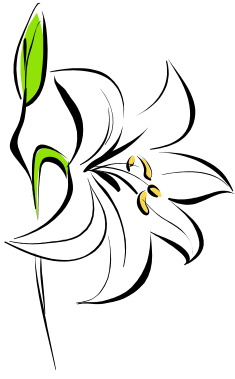
